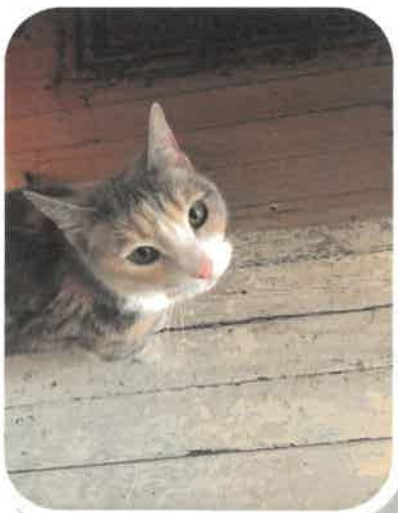
## Provide SAFETY For Victims and Their Pets
